Thembi Soddell (b. 1980) is a multi award-winning sound artist, composer and practice-based researcher whose key interest lies in the unsettling nature of abstract, acousmatic sound and its potential for generating new understandings of madness and trauma. Using large PAs or structural multi speaker installations, they offer audiences emotionally intense experiential encounters with the psychological impact of sound and darkness. Thembi is non-binary and of Polish and Anglo-Celtic heritage, born and living on Dja Dja Wurrung Country, 'Australia.'
